

Seminar on “What is Autism and Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and its Application in Home and School settings”

Speaker: *Dr. Ronald Leaf* is a licensed psychologist in the field of autism. He served as Clinic Supervisor, Research Psychologist, and Interim Director of the Young Autism Project. Dr. Leaf was contributed to *The Me Book*, and is co-author of *A Work in Progress*, a series of instructional tapes offering training for teaching autistic children. He has consulted nationally and internationally to families, school districts, day programs and residential treatment facilities in the United States.

Autism is a severe disruption of the normal development process and is viewed as a spectrum or a continuum of disorders with varying degrees of severity and levels of functioning. This seminar will provide up-to-date information on Autism Spectrum Disorders and the common behaviors a child might exhibit if one is affected. The cause and prognosis for autism and how to apply Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) in school and home settings as a first step to help increase a child's attention, independence, organizational skills, developing meaningful social relationships and increase communication and language skills will also be discussed.

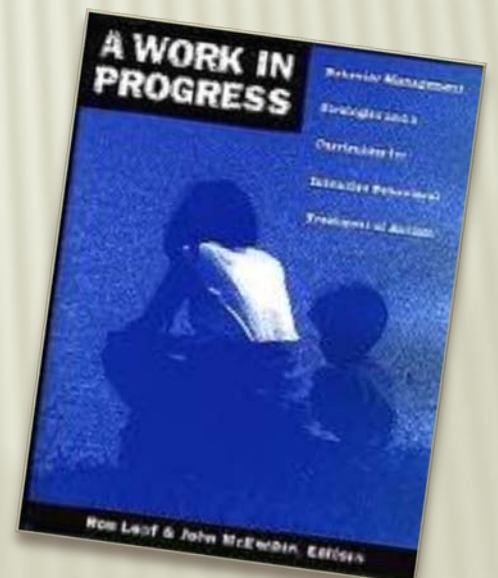
